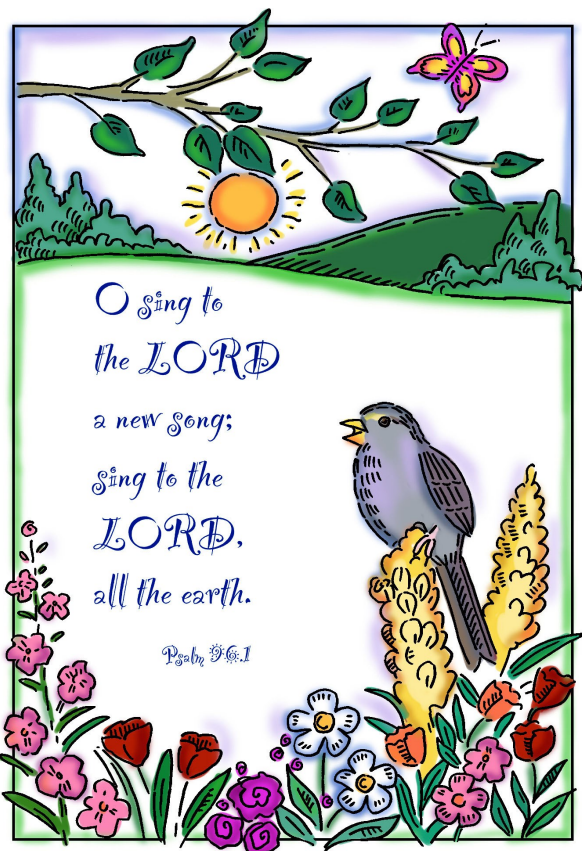

Pastor's Page:

Two May Graduations for the Spencers

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind.

1 Corinthians 1:3-4a

It isn't very often that I use this space in the newsletter to share personal news, but this is a case where I think it is warranted. Please indulge me. This is about you too.

This month my two older sons will both be graduating from college. Some of you, especially those who have watched our boys grow up at OHLC, might be interested in more details. Our middle son, Peter, will graduate from the Honors College at Washington State University on Saturday, May 3, with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He recently passed his certification test and is currently looking for a job in his field, hopefully one that will keep him in state. Our oldest son, Luke, has been attending Texas A&M on an Air Force ROTC scholarship. With all his ROTC and Corps of Cadets obligations, he needed a fifth year to complete his degree in Civil Engineering. He will graduate on Friday, May 9. That same day he will be commissioned as an officer in the United States Air Force. He has earned a pilot slot and will report to Laughlin Air Force Base in Del Rio, Texas, this summer. This base was his first choice, as it keeps him closer to his fiancée, Bekah, who is from Texas and will be finishing up her studies at Texas A&M. (Wedding date to be determined, mostly by the Air Force.)

To say we are proud of them is an understatement, and as we reflect on their achievements, we are so very grateful for you, our church family. As they have grown up in this congregation you have provided so much support, kindness, and encouragement to them over the years. Being a pastor's kid isn't always easy. Sometimes pastors' kids feel like they live in a fishbowl, with little privacy or space to be themselves or make mistakes. You have let them be themselves, without any extraordinary expectations. You have shown them grace. This has helped them to thrive, in spite of the fishbowl.

But you haven't ignored them, either. Many of you have been their biggest cheerleaders. We've had OHLC members at their sporting events, band concerts, and Eagle Scout ceremonies. So many of you have taken an interest in their lives and offered encouraging words or kind gestures to them. One

anecdote: One Sunday Louis Bartrand was wearing a dashing necktie, as usual. During the passing of the peace, Luke complimented him on it. Louis explained that it was part of his uniform from when his Air Force squadron was serving a joint mission alongside the Royal Air Force. Then Louis took it off right there in church and gave it to Luke! So many pastors' kids have horror stories of growing up in the church. Mine have been blessed with lots of stories like this. Tom Piper gave them beautiful journals with meaningful hand-written inscriptions in them when they graduated from high school. Some of their best childhood memories are of times spent at the Muzzall farm. I could go on.

This is an odd time of year for me to take vacation time, but I will be out of town May 2 through May 12 to attend these graduations and Luke's commissioning. Pastor Laurie Johnson will be preaching and leading worship on the two Sundays I'm gone and will be providing emergency pastoral care if anything should come up while I'm away. In order to be fully present with my family, I will not be viewing any electronic communications during this time. Most of the time my phone will be in my wife's purse, under her watchful eye. I entrust you instead to Pastor Laurie. I know you'll be in good hands.

As Amy and I prepare to celebrate these May milestones with our boys, know that we are giving thanks for you. You have been a wonderful congregation in which to raise them. You have helped us immensely in shaping who they are today, and we are so grateful. Much has changed since you welcomed a young family with three little boys to this church. Now as empty nesters, and especially as we become military parents, Amy and I continue to appreciate all the support, encouragement, and love you show us. Our boys might be moving on, but Amy and I aren't. Not anytime soon. We both continue to feel called to this congregation and this community. For all of us, this place feels like home. You have made it feel this way, and so from the bottom of our hearts, thank you.

Rylan: slide down the slides


Mylo: jumping and running

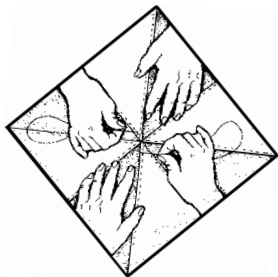

Loving Your Neighbor With Gaye Rodriguey

*"While the Israelites were camped in Gilgal, they kept the Passover in the evening on the fourteenth day of the month in the plains of Jericho."
(Joshua 5: 10, NRSV)*

One of my college friends would regularly pause in the middle of a walk or conversation to say, "Stop! Appreciate!" Pointing to something interesting, she invited an interruption in life's busyness, calling us to pay attention to the world around us and thank God for the little moments that give life its flavor.

After forty years in the wilderness wandering after their escape from slavery in Egypt, the Israelites finally entered the land God had promised to them. In Joshua 5, the first thing they do after crossing the Jordan River is to stop and celebrate a holiday. Imagine the excitement they must have felt after forty years of wilderness wandering, awaiting the fulfillment of God's promise. Yet once they arrive, the whole community stops to give thanks. Together, they celebrate the Passover festival, sharing the story of how God has been faithful to them in the past, reminding each other to appreciate how far God has brought them.

We, too, regularly mark milestones such as Christmas, Easter, birthdays, and many more. On a smaller scale, rituals happen each day in classrooms and homes, perhaps gathering to discuss what we did yesterday and then presenting something new for today. In these rituals, we have a powerful opportunity to pause and appreciate what God has done for us thus far. And in that remembering and appreciating, we prepare to live into who God created us to be.

Reflect: What rituals do you celebrate in your home? In church? How do these rituals provide encouragement to you?

Pray: Faithful God, you have brought us to this time and place, and we are grateful. Open our eyes to notice and share glimpses of your loving care all around us. Amen.

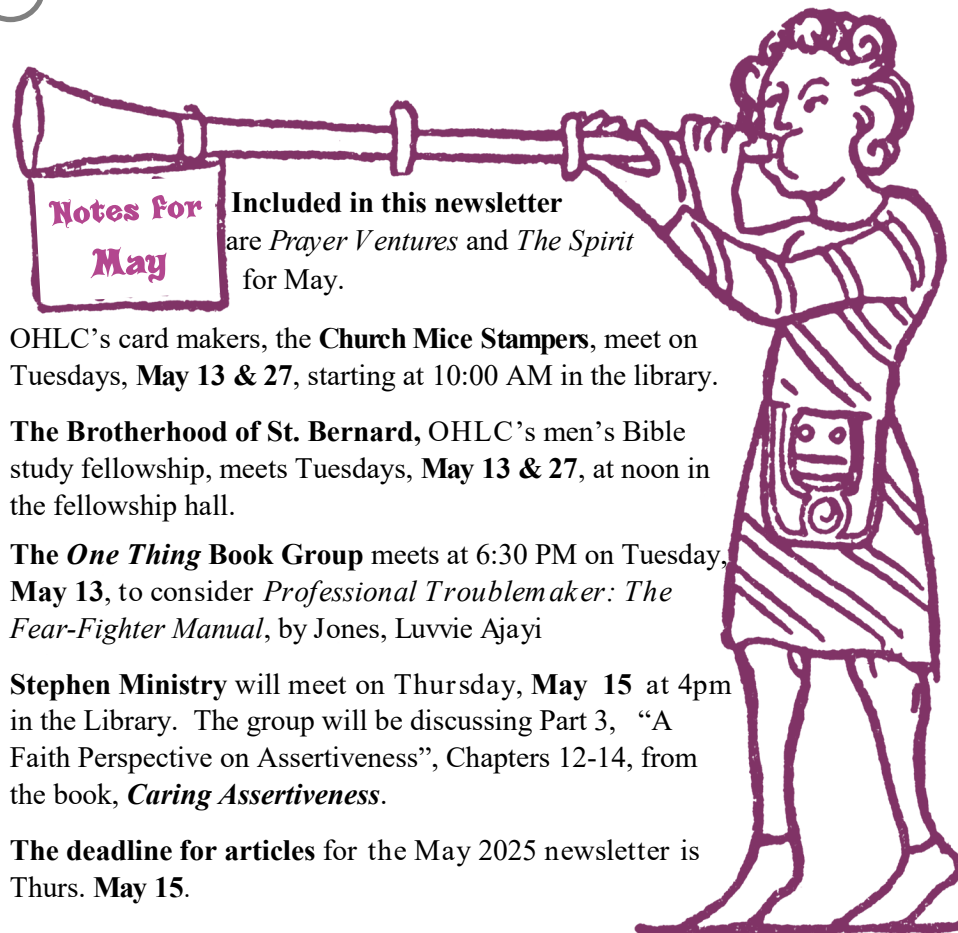


Jubilate Bells
